

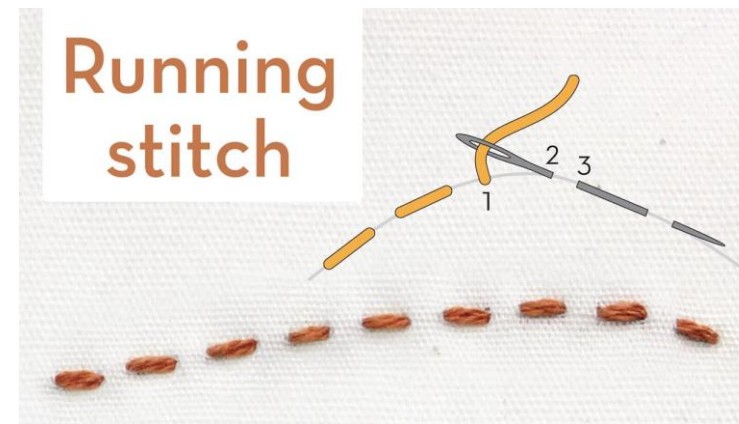
Key Vocabulary

Accurate	Neat, correct shape, size and pattern with no mistakes.
Fabric	A natural or man-made woven or knitted material that is made from plant fibres, animal fur or synthetic material.
Knot	A join made by tying two pieces of string or rope together.
Pouch	A small bag made to keep objects safe and to be carried easily.
Running-stitch	A simple style of sewing in a straight line with no overlapping.
Sew	To join or fasten by stitches made using a needle and thread.
Shape	The form of an object.
Stencil	A shape that you can draw around.
Template	A stencil which you use to help you draw a shape more easily on to different materials.
Thimble	A small metal cap to cover and protect your finger when sewing.

Running stitch

Steps to sewing

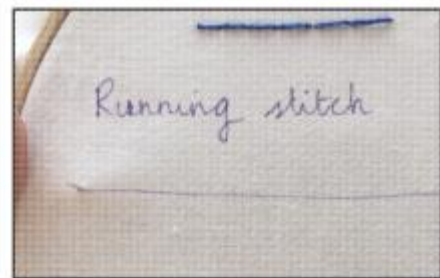
- Threading a needle.
- Tying a knot.
- Sewing the stitch.
- Tying the final knot.



Using a template



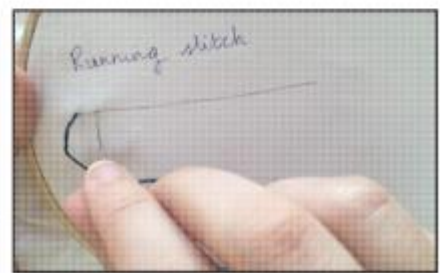
Making a pouch



1. Start from the back of the fabric. Stab your needle at the starting point and thread from the back to the front of the fabric.



2. Pull all of the thread through to the front of the fabric.



3. Next, move your needle one stitch length forward and pierce through the fabric from the front of the back of the fabric.
