We are incredibly excited about continuing to support our school community and look forward to everything the rest of the year will bring.

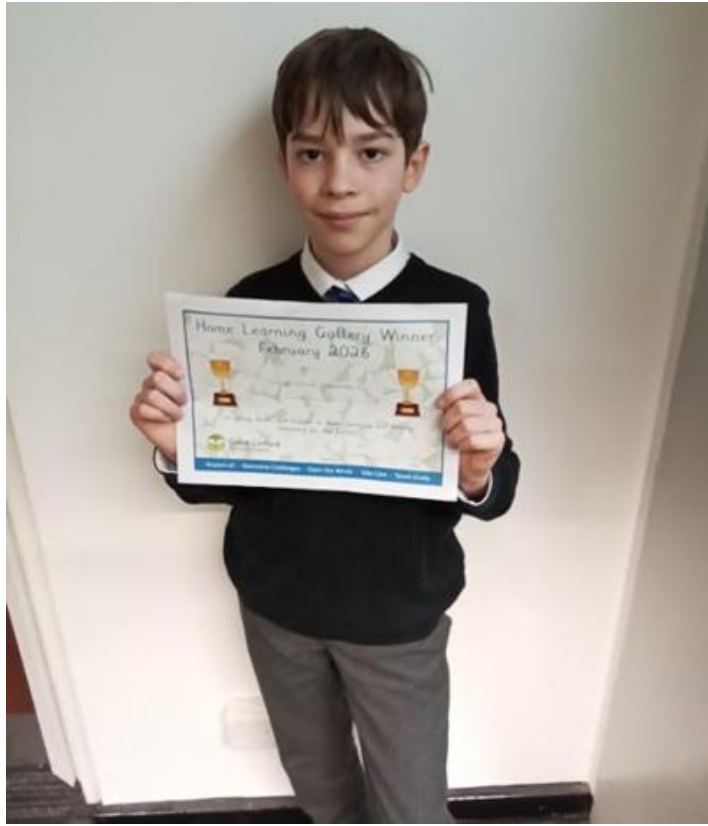

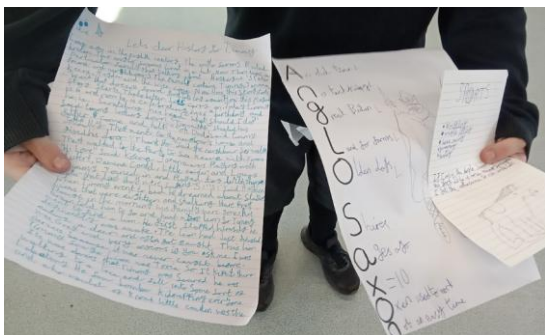
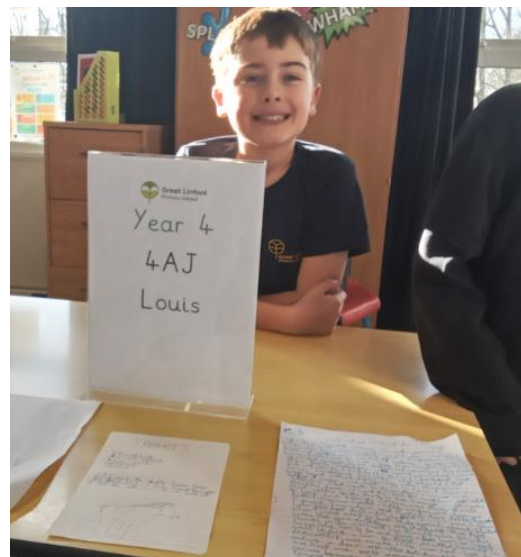
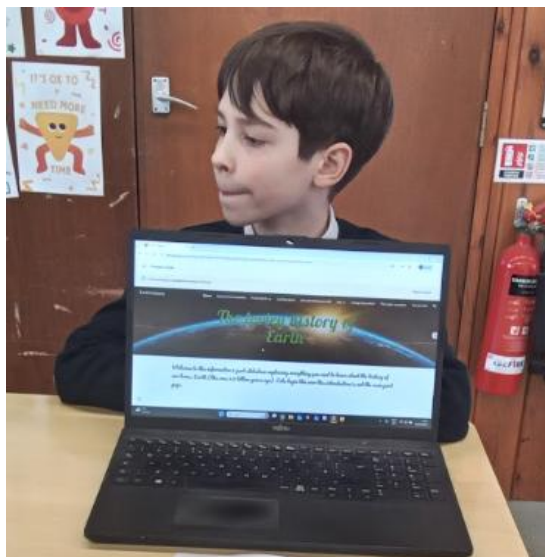
Home learning winners

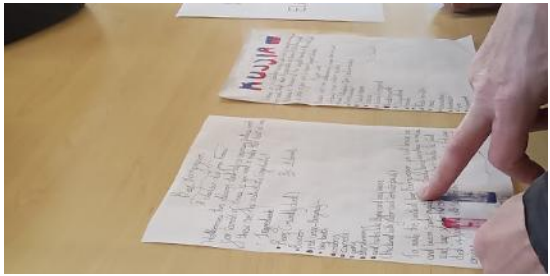
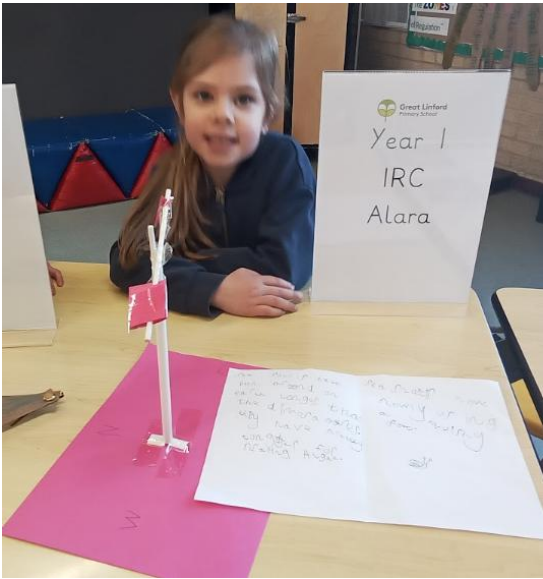

Sport at GLPS - Hoops For Health **MK Breakers Basketball Team Visit School!**

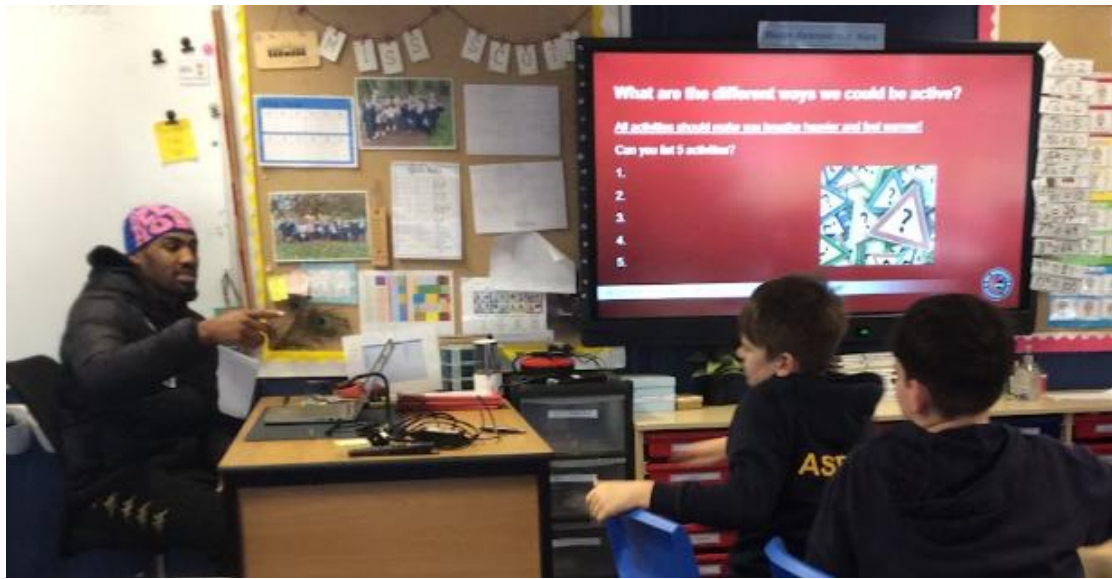
