What? - Key Vocabulary	
A rite of passage	An event that marks an important stage in someone's life.
Ceremony	An event celebrating an achievement or anniversary.
Baptism	A ceremony welcoming a new baby into the church.
Holy Communion	Receiving Jesus Christ in the sacrament of bread and wine.
Marriage	Two people agreeing to spend their lives together.
Funeral	Family and friends joining together to remember a person who has died.

What? - Core Knowledge

Rites of passage mark the transition from one stage of life to the next and can be religious and non-religious.

Christian rites of passage include:

birth, death, Confirmation and Communion, marriage and baptism.

Baptism

Most Christians baptise their new baby to welcome them into the church.

Jesus Christ was baptised.



Holy Communion

Many Christians eat bread and drink wine as it symbolises what Jesus taught his disciples during the Last Supper.

<u>Marriage</u>

The bride and groom make vows to each other in a church, exchange rings and sign a register.
