- 3. Zakat Giving money to the poor

- 5. Hajj Pilgrimage to Mecca

Islam is one of the major worldwide religions. People who follow Islam are called Muslims.

When a Muslim baby is born it's father will whisper a prayer into it's right ear. The Tasmiyah naming ceremony lasts for seven days. It shows that the new baby is accepted and protected by Allah.

A Muslim marriage celebration has several parts: the Mahr, the Nikah and the Walima.

When a Muslim dies the family wash their body using a special washing technique. The body is covered with white cloths and special ropes. The family go to the mosque and say a special prayer before the body is buried.

Muslims believe that life is a test.

The Hajj is an Islamic pilgrimage and is one of the five pillars. Muslims journey to Mecca in Saudi Arabia and carry out special rituals. The Hajj is a time for Muslims to focus on themselves and to become more in touch with who they are.
